

#### [Caution] Please read carefully before ordering!

- While wearing, please observe the animal daily to ensure that it is having food and water, and to check for behavioural and neck problems. Discontinue use if problems occur.
- Skin may swell and bleed if it is not suitable for the skin.
- Torizabethan Collar can cause problems in areas that have not previously been subject to feather picking or chewing due to neck concerns, itching and the concentration of places where the beak can reach.
- Prolonged use or pulling by the bird puts strain on the neck, increasing the likelihood of hair displacement. (Tightening too tightly, using thicker elastic or having a larger Torizabethan Collar in relation to the body will increase the area in contact with the skin.)
- We do not recommend the use of multiple layers of Torizabethan Collar.
- The Torizabethan Collar is a consumable item. If it is worn out and dangerous, replace it with a new one. Some may be out of use within a few days due to breakdown, while others may have been used for over a year.

If problems occur, discontinue use immediately. No responsibility can be taken for accidents caused by wearing.











## Case 1 Basic type

Many animal hospitals cut out clear files in the shape of donuts to make Elizabethan collars. If the neck is reinforced with tape, it can easily dig into the body and cause strain. It is also very stressful for birds, as it is difficult for them to eat as they are not free to do so. The soft material of the Torizabethan Collar reduces stress and restores hair.



## Case② Turtleneck type


Various Elizabethan collars (hospital-prescribed, commercial and homemade) were tried, but the hair picking worsened until it became unmanageable and looked like the picture 'before wearing the Torizabethan Collar'. After wearing it, the feather regrowth progressed and recovered to the point where it was no longer a problem.



### Basic type

<Material> Nylon, Sewing Elastic, Sheet (PP) All sizes are in centimetres.



## DoubleB (standard type dimensions)



#### About size selection

- Select the size taking into account not only the type of bird (small, medium or large), but also the feather picking and chewing.
- Individual differences (size and character), softness of body, cleverness (Always need to play a game of skill) use experience, etc. are also relevant.
- O Practice with the 'petite size' is recommended until getting used to it.

#### For first-time use.

- Initially they are likely to be shocked, depressed or panicked, and may wobble around until they are able to balance themselves.
- Depending on the individual, they tend to get used to it and calm down as they get tired and give up (overnight to a few days).

### Things for owners to do until they get used to it.

- Remove perches to prevent birds falling.
- O If they seem difficult to eat or drink water, place them on the floor.
- Watch carefully to avoid injury when releasing birds.
- Place the Torizabethan Collar in a visible place, such as on the cage, for a few days to alleviate panic and to familiarise with its appearance.
- If they get out of control, hold them, massage them and talk to them gently until they calm down.
